Bert Huffman's Car Barn, April 8, 2010, 9AM

Bert's sons, Lee and Al, have lovingly protected their father's collection of restored Lincolns and fire engines from all eras (100 in all). Please note—OUR MEET OFFICIALLY BEGINS at 4863 Hickory Blvd, Granite Falls, NC 28630, 828-396-1741.

This is approximately 3 miles north of the intersection of US 321 and I-40 on US 321. Signs will direct you to parking. This is probably the largest collection of restored Lincolns in the world. We will be there through lunch, which will be served on site at 11:30.

Carpenter Industries, April 8, 2:45PM

Dennis Carpenter has been a faithful supporter of the Ford, Mercury, and Lincoln restoration hobby since 1970. He now has the largest Ford authorized parts restoration facility in the world. Dennis has promised to join us and there will be tours of his museum and manufacturing operation, with large presses, stamping machines, and molding equipment in operation. The museum contains many vehicles and automobilia that are priceless to Lincoln enthusiasts. At 5pm a Carolina fish fry will be served by Ron and Faye Greene, who will bring their million-dollar fully equipped kitchen (in a semi) to the site and cook the food on the spot. Dennis's collection includes the first 1956 Mark II. He will tell us the story behind this car. Credentials for the Auto-Fair will be

handed out. Please bear in mind that Cabarrus (ka-Bear-us) County, our meet site, is DRY.

Hotels, April 8, 9, 10, 2010

We have three hotels. Two are close to the Lowe's Motor Speedway, and one is farther away with parking space for those who wish to trailer their vehicles.

Wingate by Windham, the meet hotel with hospitality suite. Exit 49 off I-85, 7843 Gateway Lane, NW, Concord, NC, 28027. 704-979-1300, 1.6 miles from Lowe's Motor Speedway, Hot breakfast included, Lincoln Car Club rate, \$99 per night.

Holiday Inn Express, exit 49 off I-85, 7772 Gateway Lane NW, Concord NC, 28027. 704-979-7900, 1.6 miles from Lowe's Motor Speedway, Hot Breakfast included, Lincoln Car club rate, \$99.75 per night.

Fairfield Inn by Marriott, exit 58 off I-85, 3033 Cloverleaf Pkwy, Kannapolis, NC, 28083, 704-795-4888. 8 miles north of the Speedway, via US 29, ample trailer parking. Hot breakfast included, Lincoln car club rate, \$79 per night.

Please use US 29 and not I-85 to approach the Speedway to avoid long traffic lines.

There is a stoplight at Roberta Church Road. Turn east. Go to the dead end. Turn right on Roberta Road and immediately left on Stough Road. The park is ahead on the left, and is within site of the Speedway, but a world apart. Please bear in mind that Cabarrus (ka-Bear-us) County, our meet site, is Dry.
